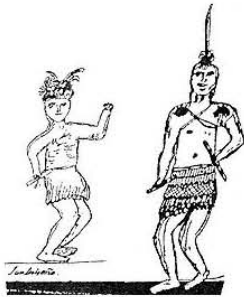


LOCATION: VISTA ELKS LODGE

The Vista area was originally inhabited by the **Luiseño**, or **Payómkawichum** Native American people, who lived on the land until 1798 when local Spanish and Mexican missions were built. These missions offered a growing number of settlers a thriving location that in 1850 became the state of California. One area settler John Frazier applied to open the first town post office in 1870 and Frazier chose the name "Vista" that then became the town name.



Episode #7: The saga continues as we see a herd of elks (AKA Elk-enders) far off on a southeast hill slowly rolling through the once-barren Southern California desert to a place called Vista. Here 20 teepees (on-wheels) closely circle the communal campfire under the direction of Don The Eagle Quijada.

Avo Joe Spychaj, our Polish tribal elder, was asked "Why are the teepees-on-wheels lined up in such a close space?" He responds in a low, hushed voice "Because the SHERIFF is in town." "How do you know this?" he was asked.

Avo Joe gave us the traditional hand signal (AKA drink-in-hand) that gaming, feasting and dancing around the camp fire always meant a sheriff would be lurking in the shadows.

Surreptitiously, many of the tribe found their way to the main tribal lodge (AKA Vista Elk's Lodge) to graze and drink with other native Elks, while others found their way to a local cantina for more traditional 1850's Spanish feasting.

Time passed and throughout the day many groups of the tribal elders squatted down in individual campsites canopied from the sun with colorful awnings. Tribal stories were spun and re-spun by former chiefs while watching the stars fade into the night. Others watched, listened, drank and even snoozed. At one point our warrior leader Ed "Rolling Rock" Mosbrook rallied many braves and squaws for a game of colored rock tossing (AKA Bocce Ball). Competition was pronounce and at times it look like a tribal war, but no blood was spilled and NO winner proclaimed. It was just good fun in the sun.

Morning brought distant thunder followed by small droplets of rain. Then a voice broke through the silence by chanting "Bloody, Bloody Mary". It was Little Buzzard, (AKA Buzz Dobbs of Buzz's Bar) and Jerry Fancy Wheel (AKA Jerry Tretter of Buffalo Milk Barn fame) two of the camp's meanest morning mixers of firewater, announcing that the morning watering hole was safe to drink (that meant the bar was open). 35 dollars was later found at the water holes edge wrapped in a squirrel pelt. The Indian writing on the skin said "FOR THE PURPLE PIG". Thanks Little Buzzard and Fancy Wheel for your contribution and yes we did recognize you tribal hen scratching on the pelt.

Soon local warning smoke signals could be seen. "What does it mean?" we asked tribal leader Linda Lightfoot Mosbrook. She quickly stared down at the ground. Tracks show many moccasin foot prints but only one set of boot prints and sign means you must ask Ed Rolling rock Mosbrook.

Rolling rock takes on look and exclaims "Hide! Hide! Hide!" But, he said it to too late. Sheriff Little Buzzard was spotting tribal deeds. Now every tribal member would need to pay-up their wampum. Sheriff Little Buzzard galloped into the sun set to deliver his large purse full of wampum declaring MORE PIG FOOD and "Hi Ho, Purple Pig away!" Thanks Sheriff Little Buzzard for you extra fine efforts to feed the pig while not destroying the tribe.

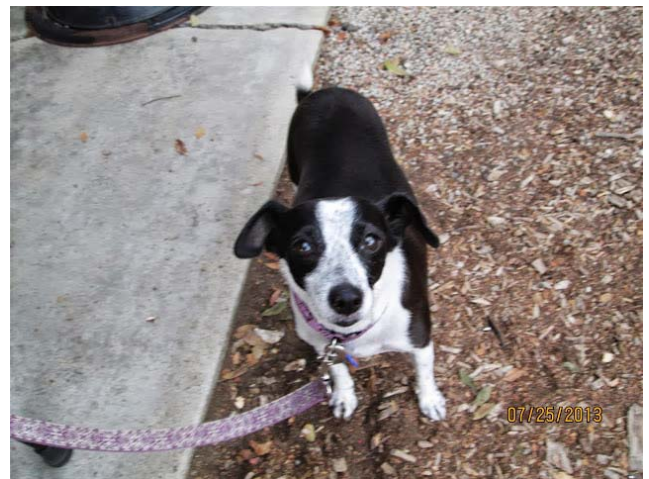
The saga continues at our next meeting. Come join the tribe (AKA Elk-enders) for feasting, fun and fellowship in a future encampment.

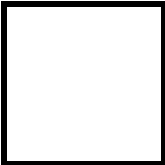
